## Hundreds board jigsaw:

Photocopy the hundreds chart below onto A3 paper, and cut pieces up with at least 6 squares together for each piece. Make the pieces different shapes. Laminate the pieces to use for a jigsaw puzzle. Consider making multiple copies of the chart and cutting pieces for a single jigsaw puzzle so that some of the squares need to overlap and there are some gaps. It is very fun to use like this and requires much deeper thinking from kids!
