- Practicalities: simple strategies for setting out your classroom to drive learning, manage behaviour in different lesson types and make it easier to get to every student

Mentoring and follow up for 12 months

Quarterly online sessions with your trainers to ask questions and deal with issues

Once per term spend an hour online with your trainers so that you can ask questions, consolidate what you have learned and take the next steps on your teaching journey. Each session will have a theme aligned with issues that arise at that time of the year (e.g. we will talk about reporting before report cards are due, we will talk about diagnostic testing ready to start the year).

Community support

Each attendee will be invited to join our Facebook group for Early Career Teachers. This group consists not only of Early Career Teachers and our trainers, but also more experienced teachers who we have invited to act as moderators, give advice and help to support you in your teaching journey. Group members are invited to share resources in the group as well as being encouraged to pose and answer questions.

Access recorded webinars
